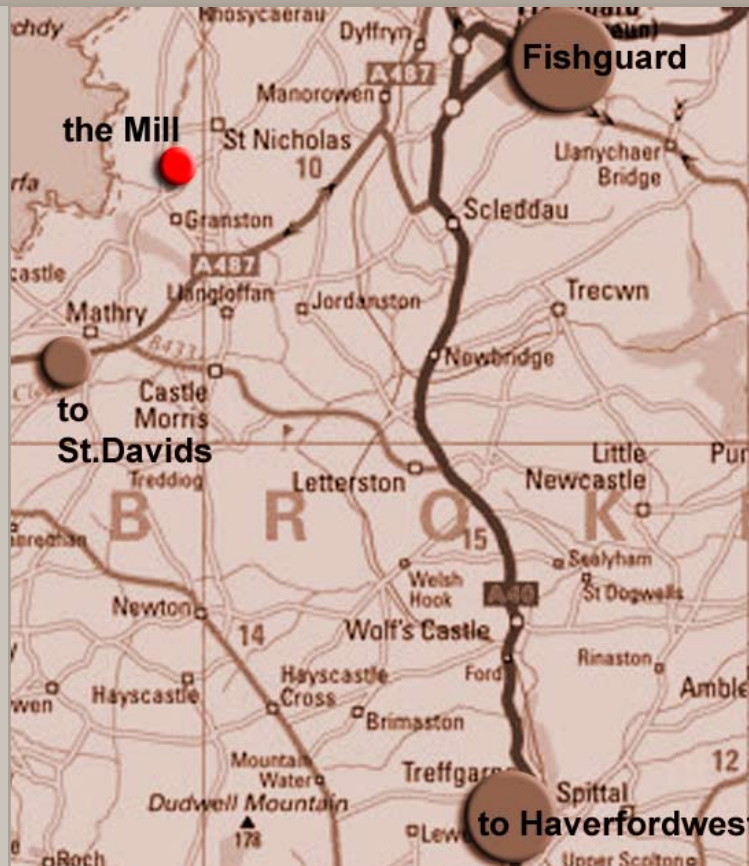

- from Haverfordwest to Fishguard on the A40 turn Left in Letterston opposite "Something's Cooking" and follow signs for Castlemorris
- in Castlemorris turn right for Llangloffan and drive over a small stone bridge. Take left fork in Llangloffan signed for "Abermawr" past the entrance to the Cheese Farm / Tides Restaurant.
- cross over the next two main roads and you will see a sign for "Melin Tregwynt".

there is parking and a picnic area within the mill grounds.

Tregwynt is in the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park and there are beaches a beautiful coastline, spectacular cliff and woodland paths all within walking distance.

For centuries local farmers used to bring their fleeces to be washed in the nearby stream, then spun and woven into fine wool blankets for their families.

This same stream provided power for the mill and today you can still see the water wheel turning, along with the original leather belt and pulley system that once drove all the machines at the mill

melin tregwynt has been owned by the same family since 1912.

Most of the cloths you see being woven here are traditional to Wales and many are unique to Melin Tregwynt.

We believe that good design is all about getting the details right; and we've always tried to make things that are useful, beautiful to look at and a little bit special.

Today we design and weave our beautiful blankets, throws and cushions for customers all over the world.

Over 20 local people work here at the mill, and products from this remote corner of Wales can be found in design-led shops and smart hotels in the U.K. U.S.A. Europe and Japan

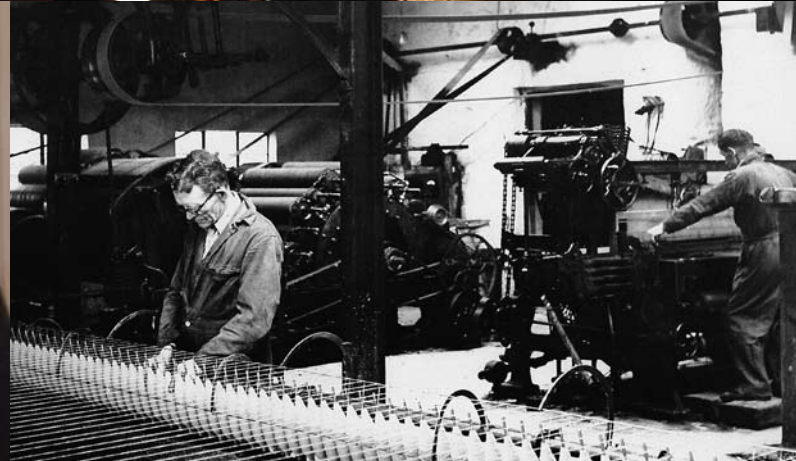


Over the years melin tregwynt has moved from traditional flying shuttle looms to modern high speed rapier looms.

We no longer card or spin here at the mill but you can watch the weaving on week days throughout the year.

At the millshop you will find a huge selection of blankets throws and cushions, together with a clearance section for ends of ranges, discontinued lines and samples.

We also stock a wide range of other gifts, clothes and foods, many made in Wales and chosen to complement our distinctive look. If you can't make it to any of our shops we do have a mail order service.

The coffee shop offers home made and local produce for a real taste of Wales: cakes, pastries, cawl, soup, ice cream and light snacks plus cappuccino and espresso coffee and speciality teas.
